# LETTERS IN THE CORNERS OF 5 SHEETS

- 1. In the Beginning Brief, you are told: "The corners would be a great place to begin. Will you lend me your ear? It all starts with a single drop of blood."
- 2. You will notice that the 5 photocopies you have all have groupings of letters in the 4 corners.
- 3. You will also notice that each photocopy is numbered. Place them in the correct order.
- 4. Examine the one with an ear and find the diagram that shows a drop of blood.
- 5. This diagram tells you how to read the message contained in the four corners.
- 6. Start at the blood droplet and follow the arrows.
- 7. Repeat the process over and over again until you get a website address.







## PHOTOCOPY #1/EAR



#### Puzzle #1:

- 1. You will see a series of statements made by Jack the Ripper.
- 2. The image behind the text is a barcode that tells you where to look for your clue.
- 3. On the flipside there is also a barcode with numbers.
- 4. If you re-order the statements according to the numbered barcode, you should be able to obtain a name from the first letter of each line.

- 1. You have a string of letters that instructs you to divide them up by a specific number.
- 2. Determine how many victims the original Jack the Ripper took and add two to that number, per the instruction.
- 3. Then, divide the string of letters into groupings of that number.
- 4. Stack the groupings of letters on top of each other and read the message you are given.







## PHOTOCOPY #2/EYE



#### Puzzle #1:

- 1. You have a series of lines of gibberish along with a couple of statements from Jack the Ripper.
- 2. The key to this is reading these lines aloud as is mentioned in the second statement.
- 3. He mentions cutting out all of the eyes.
- 4. After reading statement one, however, you should see that there are actually 3 words that make the same sound.
- 5. So, you would remove every instance of 'I,' "aye," and 'eye."
- 6. What you are left with is the answer.

- 1. The next bit of text from Jack the Ripper mentions the directions certain eyes are looking.
- 2. On the back there are numerous eyes. Some are looking in different directions.
- 3. Find the letters in the grid that correspond to the eyes looking in the direction mentioned.
- 4. You should end up with a name.







## PHOTOCOPY #3/GRID



#### Puzzle #1:

- 1. Jack's next series of thoughts relate to the grid.
- 2. The underlined words tell you what to do to the grid based on the series of ones and zeroes on the back side.
- 3. Make sure to go in the correct order based on how the lines are numbered.
- 4. You will obtain an image that should be easily recognized.

- 1. You have a series of straight razors that are numbered.
- 2. Take them in order and draw them out on a sheet of scrap paper.
- 3. Note how each of the razors look like certain letters in the alphabet.
- 4. You will obtain a name from this.







## PHOTOCOPY #4/OLD BOSS



#### Puzzle #1:

- 1. Like his namesake, the modern day Jack the Ripper isn't a great speller.
- 2. However, this time the mistakes are on purpose.
- 3. Find all of the letters that are missing from the letter and write them in order.

- 1. The razor has letters on both the blade and the handle.
- 2. Imagine how the razor should close and how those letters would go together were that to happen.
- 3. You should be able to obtain a name by combining both columns of letters.







## PHOTOCOPY #5/WORD SEARCH



#### Puzzle #1:

- 1. Beneath his rantings, Jack the Ripper has provided a series of two and three letter groupings.
- 2. Say each one aloud and write down what you say.
- 3. You should obtain a name from this.

- 1. Find all of the words in the word search.
- 2. Write down what is left that isn't part of any circled/highlighted word.











Camera #1: Solve both puzzles located on Photocopy #1 and you should get a name to provide the initials needed and the name of a location to get the word needed.

Camera #2: Solve both puzzles on Photocopy #2. One of those should give you a name which will provide the initials you need. The other will give you a website address. Navigate to that website and search for a review that has a connection to the partial name you found after unlocking Camera #1.

Camera #3: Solve both puzzles on Photocopy #3 to get the body part required and the name that will unlock this file.

Camera #4: Solve both puzzles on Photocopy #4 to get the full name which will provide the intials needed as well as the location name.

Camera #5: Solve both puzzles on Photocopy #5 to get the initials needed and the body part needed to unlock this file.







## **QUESTION MARK CARD**



- 1. By unlocking all 5 of the cameras, you should have been able to piece together the full name of Jack the Ripper.
- 2. If you write that name out using the blanks on the back of the card and pull the red letters, you will obtain part of an address that will be used to finally locate Jack the Ripper.







## **BLOOD SPATTER SHEET/PHONE**



- 1. To get a street address, you will need both the house number and the street.
- 2. The street is obtained from the question mark card.
- 3. The number is obtained from the blood spatter sheet.
- 4. There are a series of 4 blood spatter patterns followed by a question mark. This represents the full address.
- 5. By counting each spatter pattern and getting those 4 numbers and providing the answer you got from the question mark card, you will successfully have the address where Jack the Ripper can be located.
