THE SHERLOCK CONUNDRUM CHINT FILES

One Puzzle Per Page

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MORPHINE VIAL/BRICK WALL

- 1. Notice what's underlined on the morphine vial. That's the key.
- 2. The numbers on the brick wall follow the same pattern/logic.
- 3. If 221 is B, then 332 would be C, 443 would be D, and so on...



CODE ON WEBSITE

- 1. When you go to the website obtained by decoding the numbers on the brick wall, you see the sentence, "Revenge is a dish best served cold if only you can find the key."
- 2. There is a word painted in blood that means "Revenge" in German.
- 3. There is an alphabet on the back of page one of the case notes that shows a key.
- 4. The red word is what you use to fill in the blanks. This provides your new alphabet.
- 5. Now on a piece of paper write out your new alphabet(all in one line if possible) and then write out the normal alphabet above or below it.
- 6. Use that to decode the message at the bottom of the website that begins with, "debg..." If you don't get a word after decoding the first four letters you might be decoding the message in reverse. So try going the other way using your two alphabets.
- 7. The translated message will start with, "head..."



CHALK OUTLINE

- 1. After you've decoded the message from the website, it tells you which areas of the body to examine on the chalk outline and in what order.
- 2. You will seven letter that form one word, it is a name.



PILES OF ASH

- 1. At the scene of the crime were left various piles of ash that are surely a clue of some sort.
- 2. On the website is an image that relates to the piles of ash. When you click it, you find one of Sherlock Holmes' famous monographs.
- 3. Match each ash sample up to the piles of ash left at the crime scene. Use their abbreviations in order to obtain a two word location.



KEYS

- 1. Your instructions are to use the name you found and the <u>second word</u> of the location.
- 2. The name was found from the chalk line puzzle.
- 3. The location was found from the ash puzzle.



WEBSITE: ATOMIC SYMBOL

- 1. You will have to solve and open the unlock for the keys before you can do this.
- 2. To unlock the atomic symbol on the website, look on the back of the band flyer and use the word beside the atomic symbol as the password.



THE SPECKLED BAND

- 1. On the back of The Speckled Band flyer is a series of numbers along with a message that mentions chemistry.
- 2. Is there a place on the website that might relate to chemistry? Click the correct icon.
- 3. To unlock the atomic symbol on the website, look on the back of the band flyer and use the word beside the atomic symbol as the password.
- 4. The hint in the letter mentions that the number is important.
- 5. Find which element corresponds to each number and write down the letters which represent it.
- 6. You will get a three-word message. Use this for the "What do you look for in the library?" question.



WHAT DO YOU LOOK FOR IN THE LIBRARY?

- 1. You get the answer to this by solving the puzzle on the back of The Speckled Band flyer.
- 2. You will get a three-word message. Use the last two words as the password.



STICK MEN/DANCING MEN CODE

- 1. You will need to have unlocked the "What do you look for in the library?" before you can use the stick men.
- 2. Inside are a strange series of stick figures.
- 3. You should have seen these scattered throughout the mystery at this point, each one corresponding to a specific letter of the alphabet.
- 4. Determine what the message says.



WHICH LOCKER?

- 1. You will need to have solved the stick men/dancing men code before you can do this puzzle.
- 2. The puzzle inside the library brochure answers this question.
- 3. Note: type out the number as a word (example: 1 would be typed as one)



LETTER GRID

- 1. There is a hint on The Speckled Band poster that relates to this.
- 2. It says, "Performing their hit single, 'From the Head of the Snake' produced by Grid Records"
- 3. That links the image from the locker to the grid of letters.
- 4. The head of the snake shows you which letter of the grid to start with.
- 5. Follow the path along the grid that most closely follows the shape of the snake.
- 6. Get a three word message.
- 7. The message will start with "check..."



WHERE DO YOU CHECK?

- 1. The locker/grid puzzle answers this.
- 2. Simply type in the word that you obtain.



WEBSITE: VIOLIN

- 1. This will not be useful to you until you reach the final envelope.
- 2. To unlock the violin from the website, read the note on the back of the flyer to get the name of the type of violin Sherlock Holmes had. Use that word as the password.



SHEET MUSIC/VIOLIN

- 1. Notice that certain notes on the sheet music are circled in a certain color that corresponds to the chart on the violin card.
- 2. First, determine the name of each note circled.
- 3. You may need some help with this. Artie E. Moore's website may be able to help.
- 4. Note: in order to unlock the website file you will need to answer the question posed. Hint: you've already read the answer at this point in a previous document.
- 5. For each specific note, start at the letter name of the note and move along the alphabet that many spaces to see what it translates into.
- 6. Do this for all the notes that are circled.



WEBSITE: MAGNIFYING GLASS

- 1. You will need to have reached the final envelope before you can do this puzzle.
- 2. To unlock the magnifying glass from the website, use the word beside the magnifying glass at the bottom of the paper with the grid of numbers and words.



NUMBER GRID PUZZLE

- 1. You will need something from the website to help solve this.
- 2. Notice there is a symbol in this section that also appears on the website. Here is where you can find the unlock password for that file.
- 3. Follow the rules you find on the website to eliminate all but a single square



RANSOM-STYLE NOTE

- 1. You are told to provide two pieces of information to unlock this.
- 2. Where to look and what you are looking for?
- 3. One of these you obtained from the music puzzle. The other you obtained from the grid puzzle.
- 4. Enter the correct information.



WIGGINS

- 1. The boy tells you that you need to obtain a very special word from the kennels and provides the code to get in via the titles of four Sherlock Holmes stories.
- 2. The book on the website has a complete reference list of those stories to help you determine the correct numbers.



DOG TAG

- 1. You need to unlock the kennel before you can do this.
- 2. The dog's name is split up into four parts.
- 3. You should have seen these groups of letters throughout the mystery along with what each grouping of letters is equal to.
- 4. Once you have all four parts to spell Baskerville, you also have the parts needed to spell the special word.
- 5. Use this word with the two letters missing from the stick men/Dancing Men alphabet to solve the box.



SOLUTION

1. Use the word you get from the dog tag puzzle with the two letters missing from the stick men/Dancing Men alphabet to solve the box.
